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
## INTRODUCTION

The Mahakumbh Indigenous knowledge system is a structure that transmits knowledge through oral customs and rituals inspired by traditions and experience. This religious ritual is the perfect place to apply, embody, and renew sacred knowledge in collective action. Based on Hindu mythology and religious heritage, the symbolic basis of Maha Kumbh is the story of the churning of the ocean and the elixir of immortality (Amrit). This national religious festival is conducted at the location where the drop of nectar had fallen. The confluence point of Triveni Place in Prayagraj, Uttar Pradesh, is where Ganga, Yamuna, and the mythological Saraswati meet. This locale is one of the places that is holy. This confluence demonstrates the interconnectedness of geography and cosmology. People consider bathing in the water of this confluence and taking a dip to perform their devotional duties. This event reinforces the dominant notion of indigenous knowledge systems. And it shows how nature, consciousness, and spiritual knowledge cannot be separated. Keeping the pandemic in mind, people should follow moral discipline, spiritual purification, and spiritual knowledge in this religious event. Mahakumbh marks the biggest religious event ever in human history. However, it is important to recognize that indigenous knowledge systems are not fixed relics of the past; rather, these are vibrant, transformative, and appropriate methods of transmitting knowledge. Sacred rituals, such as the royal bath, Kalpavas, mass discourses (pravachan), and tapasya, are the means of transmitting Hindu belief systems to the next generation. At the same time, these religious events confirm continuity and are also capable of taking forward the current socio-cultural realities. These rituals are embodied systems of aesthetic knowledge that codify abstract philosophical concepts into lived experiences. The Mahakumbh exemplifies a bridge between modern systems and traditional knowledge. The use of technologies in crowd management, infrastructure, and health services as the Maha Kumbh portrays ancient rituals shows the universal adaptability of the Indian knowledge system. Furthermore, it also promotes cultural diffusion and cultural



exchange. It is a platform that includes global communities, various regional cultures, folk arts, philosophies, and beliefs. Therefore, we can view the Maha Kumbh as a living civilizational repository of indigenous knowledge systems. The Kumbh Mela is a living example of how a religious tradition, rooted in Hindu philosophy, can keep the elements safe; it keeps adapting its rituals, aesthetics, and collective activities according to the times. ## Kumbh Mela Periodicity



### Types of Kumbh Mela

Kumbh Mela is organized in many types. These religious events are organized by looking at the stars, planets, and time. Kumbh Mela is unique in relation to culture. Only after 144 years, the Mahakumbh Mela is held in Prayagraj, in the state of Uttar Pradesh. It is one of the rare and very special events for people who adhere to this religious practice. There is also the Purna Kumbh Mela, which is a religious pilgrimage. It is performed after twelve years on four major pilgrimage points at Prayagraj, Haridwar, Ujjain, and Nashik. After every 6 years, Ardh Kumbh Mela is held in Prayagraj and Haridwar. This is a regional event in which an intermediate is the importance of the holy meet is emphasized. Apart from this, there is also a Magh Kumbh Mela, which is held once in Prayagraj every year. It is also called a



small-scale Kumbh, yet there is a large number of pilgrims. Although all these types of Kumbh Mela have different scales and durations. But one thing is similar in all these, which is a ritual purpose of obtaining spiritual purification, obtaining salvation, continuity of pilgrimage traditions, and strengthening religious values of the community.

### **Kumbh Mela: Mythological, astronomical and historical development.**

Kumbh Mela is one of the most significant Hindu mythological narrations. The most important word is "sea churning." According to the Puranic Code, the sea was born to get Amrit during the immortality battle between the Gods and the Asuras. It is said that the nectar was born from the sea. During the same churning of the sea, drops of Amrit fell at terrestrial locations such as Haridwar, Nashik, Ujjain, and Prayagraj. For this reason, these places gained religious importance and eventually became the main site of the Kumbh Mela Festival. It has been reported in Hindu literature that some definite astronomical alignments have the presence of divine energy in rivers located in these religious places. The Hindu religion and devotees claim that bathing at this time leads to spiritual purification, forgiveness, and the salvation of sins.

The name Kumbha is used to denote the pitcher vessel in which the nectar of immortality was to be kept. The name Kumbh is not limited to social and religious importance. Rather, it also has astrological and spiritual significance. Cosmic science plays a vital role in determining the calendar of Kumbh festivals. The annual Magha Mahakumbh Mela is considered a very rare event in which planetary transits recur. The position of Jupiter in special quantities of the cycle signals these tough astrological conditions. Mahakumbha in Prayagraj is considered to have occurred only once in the past 144 years, which adds to its unique spiritual and cultural significance.

The Kumbh Mela has developed as a supreme religious gathering in Hinduism for decades. Historians have reported the number of about two to two and a half million pilgrims in 1796 and 1808. This information shows that the Hindu community has been on a big pilgrimage in India since the colonial period. The nature of the journey was accepted (Wikipedia, 2025). However, the 1892–1908 colonial archive documents indicate the presence of about 300,000–400,000 pilgrims. This contraction was the main reason for the spread of malaria. The infrastructure shortcomings and administrative challenges are held responsible for the common era (Wikipedia, 2025).

After independence, the Kumbh Mela was a progressive renaissance in India. The 1954 edition had the presence of about five million pilgrims on the auspicious day of Amavasya. This kind of presence



showed a commendable religious rebirth. By 1977, the number of participants had doubled to about 10 million, showing deep religious participation in modern Indian society (Wikipedia, 2025).

Aquarius Mela 2013 was an international festival. The number of devotees during the festival period was more than 200 million. This event is traditionally regarded as one of the largest collective religious occasions in the history of humanity (Britannica, 2025). In the same age-old tradition, the Mahakumbh Mela 2025 lasted 45 days and was organized in Prayagraj from 13 to 26 January. (Wikipedia, 2025). During this time, there was an unprecedented number of pilgrims involved in this religious practice. The official figure of those who were present at the close of Mahakumbh 2025 was about 650 million, showing a very great change compared to the initial figure. Before organizing, there was an estimate of about 400 million people (Business Standard, 2025). Independent foreign coverage also told of the full presence of approximately 663 million people by the end of the festival (Reuters, 2025).

### **Theoretical and conceptual basis of the study**

The theoretical framework in the current study is based on an interdisciplinary approach. It is based on the study of human science, religious studies, sociology, aesthetics, and indigenous knowledge systems (IKS). The ritual of Kumbh turns into tangible manifestations of intangible Hindu philosophical ideas such as purity, karma, cyclic time, and salvation. Mishra (2025) sheds light on the aesthetic nature of Aquarius rituals. They believe that the beauty interpretation of Aquarius traditions (Mishra, 2025) is a dynamic form of the presence of the arbitrage and digital access. These religious rituals are a mixture of knowledge, tradition, and technique. According to Tiwari (2025), it is a major medium of combination of regional and sectarian diversity for the consistent Hindu community. It acts as an important medium in providing dynamic continuity to cultural transmission with the interpretation of Hindu traditions and their religions.

Pilgrims believe that according to astrology, bathing at an auspicious time destroys sins, and salvation (spiritual liberation) is attained. Legendary Aquarius is associated with the legend of sea churning, in which some drops of nectar fell at four holy places. This story reinforces the cosmic purity of these places. Location is made available for a difficult penance like meditation, yoga, sacrifice, spiritual discourse, and Kalpas, which makes the pilgrim strengthen their personal spirituality. This festival promotes collective devotion, paralance and self-interview. The devotees often experience amazement, purification and 'mass enthusiasm' (Shared Effervescence). Through this, the devotees contribute significantly to the spiritual effectiveness of the beauty and emotional aspect. Mahakumbh Mela revolves around many holy rituals. This ritual displays the ancient traditions of Hindu spirituality.

These are the most important royal baths. In this religious bath, the sadhu and devotees dive into the holy water of Triveni Sangam. Ganga Aarti River, who has been with lamps and hymns, reveals the price of respect towards the Goddess. Sharadhalu also follows the Kalpavas. This imbed displays self-discipline and times of restraint. Deep donation is made in rituals in the rivers. Deep donation is a symbol of the victory of light over darkness. Panchkoshi orbitra rituals combine devotees with sacred geography and



religious backgrounds. All these religious activities show the continuity between the ancient Hindu traditions and modern nature.

### **Philosophical ritual aesthetics significance of the Mahakumbh Mela.**

In the vast scenario of Mahakumbh, 'rasa' and 'cultural symbolism' are not different, but they have been in each other. The ritual of Mahakumbh reflects the basic ideals of Hindu aesthetics, under which symbolism, rasa, and tangible spirituality (incarnated spirituality) are merged. The greatness of Kumbh is inherent in that philosophical principles are brought out of book pages and converted into a vibrant experience. This is the reason why the Kumbh Mela understands only a not huge 'crowd,' while the scene of this crowd becomes the path to 'salvation' for a devotee.

Every action in the Mahakumbh is covered by many layers of symbolism to the waves of devotional music and the waves of devotional music and the glory of sannyasis. These rituals bring extremely micro and abstract philosophical ideas like Cyclical Time and Liberation under the scope of human experience. Here, salvation becomes a reality to be felt in the echo of the coldness and the echo of the water, but it becomes a reality. Moving a multi-sensory environment together with sound, color, speed and sacred location (Sacred Space). Thereby originates devotion, paralance and collective consciousness. It is not only stronger the effectiveness of rituals, but also underscores the 'experiential character' of traditional Indian knowledge systems.

#### **1. Rasa theory: The ocean of emotions**

Mahakumbh is not only a group of rituals, but also a lively display of the rasa. When a devotee stands on the Sangam coast, he not only soaks his body, but also passes through different levels of emotions:

- Bhakti and Shanta Rasa (Devotion and Tranquility): A deep 'cool Rasa' over the entire coast at the time of aarti and meditation. The devotees, between the pronunciation of mantras and the waves of the Ganges, feel peace and association with peace and God.
- Adbhuta Rasa (The Sense of Wonder): When the devotees look at the procession of thousands of Naga sadhus during the royal bath, their conscience and Lepi and Shankhanad, then the 'wonderful Rasa' (amazement) is communicated. This scene takes it to a mythological period by cutting it from the physical world.



- Veer Rasa (Spiritual Heroism): The self-restraint of the sannyasis reflects the water-samadhi and hard penance in the cold, which inspires the common man to conquer his senses.
2. **Cultural symbolism: A philosophy in every action**

Every corner of Aquarius is full of symbols. It provides the depth of Hindu philosophy in simple actions:

- Triveni Sangam (symbol of unity): The meeting of Ganga (Karma), Yamuna (Devotion), and Invisible Saraswati (Knowledge) indicates that the balance of these three in life is mandatory for perfection.
- Elixir Kalash (symbol of immortality): Aquarius (pitcher) is a symbol of the body. Just as the nectar came out of the sea brain, the soul has received the salvation of the soul.
