Social Structure and Lifestyle

The Baga Janjati generally lives in small villages surrounded by forests. Their houses are usually made of mud, bamboo, and thatched roofs. The family system is mostly patriarchal, and joint families are common in rural areas.

Marriage is considered a sacred institution in their society. Traditional customs and rituals play an important role in marriage ceremonies. The community follows its own social rules and traditions, which are respected by all members.

Economic Condition and Occupation

The main occupation of the Baga tribe is agriculture and forest-based activities. Many families depend on small-scale farming, collection of forest products, and daily wage labor. Due to limited resources and lack of modern agricultural techniques, their income level remains low.

Poverty, unemployment, and seasonal migration are common issues faced by the community. However, government schemes such as G RAM G and tribal welfare programs have provided some support to improve their economic condition.

Educational Status

Education among the Baga Janjati is gradually improving, but the literacy rate is still lower compared to the state average. Lack of schools in remote areas, poverty, and early involvement in household work are major reasons for low educational attainment.

Government initiatives such as free education, scholarships, and mid-day meal schemes have encouraged school enrollment. However, dropout rates remain a concern.
